CORONAVIRUS CASE CONFIRMED – Arbor Terrace January 7th, 2020

Dear Valued Samaritan Bethany Employees:

Today, we have identified a confirmed case of Coronavirus (COVID-19) in an Essential Caregiver through Season's Hospice. This hospice worker had interaction with 3 resident's 1 in IL, 1 in MC, 1 in AL. This hospice worker was wearing PPE during their entire visit at Arbor Terrace. We are monitoring all residents' symptoms with 2x/day screening and all staff are still being screened before the beginning of each shift. Please know that we are taking all precautions to stop the spread of this virus. Our priority is to keep everyone safe and healthy. We are in very close communications with local and state health officials to ensure we are taking all appropriate steps at this time.

What you can do: As we respond to this development, we remind everyone of the following:

- ✓ Continue to use the infection control training and practices you already implement each day. We will inform you if any additional measures needed to be taken.
- ✓ Avoid sharing or spreading misinformation or private information protected by HIPAA. Please consult official resources for the latest information.
 - Any media or external inquiries should be deferred to Sue Knutson.
- ✓ All staff will continue to be screened for illness at the beginning of each shift. Additionally, we ask that you perform your own self-screening when you are home at the end of your shift, and continue to self-monitor when you are not working. If you have questions about screening, Minnesota has a wonderful online resource called If You Are Sick that provides guidance.
- ✓ If you believe you may have COVID-19, contact one of the following triage lines for testing information
