## Arbor Terrace Rate Notice Effective September 1st 2021



July 29th, 2021

Dear Residents and Families,

As you may already know we are transitioning to Assisted Living with Dementia Care Licensure starting August 1st, 2021. This license is comprehensive and covers all areas of Arbor Terrace Independent Living, Assisted Living, and Memory Care. This licensure change is regulated by the Minnesota Department of Health and requires us to revise the lease, service plans and additional services agreements.

We have carefully considered the budget for our next fiscal year, as difficult as it is during these unprecedented times, we are implementing an increase to the base rates and services starting September 1, 2021. After reviewing the new legislature and requirements it is apparent we must change our rates to sustain high quality care and retain our essential healthcare workers. In the rate we did deduct meals and some services from the base rate and they will now be billed separately.

Each resident will need to sign a new lease, service plan, and an additional services agreement with Rachael Paddock, Housing Community Leader. In your individual letters there was a date and time assigned to each of you. If you can not make it on the assigned day or time, please reach out and reschedule with Rachael.

#### **Visit Guidelines**

- •There is no longer a maximum number of visits per week. You are able to visit your loved one as many times as you would like.
- •There are no longer restrictions on the length of a visit.
- •You must screen at the front desk, even if visiting outside
- •Please be sure to maintain a 6 foot distance between other visitors and residents
- •If the resident and visitor is fully vaccinated you can choose to be without your mask when in the resident's room. Masks still must be worn when walking through Arbor Terrace.
- •2-3 visitors can visit a single resident at a time
- •Visits are to occur during the hours of 8am 6pm

You will continue to use the website for reservations. An area has been added for you to enter in your estimated arrival time for the date and timeframe you choose to schedule a visit.

Once the reservation is approved, the visitor will receive a confirmation email. A confirmation email could take up to 24 hours to receive. If you do not receive a confirmation email please check your junk or spam folders.

With the Delta Variant in the beginning stages and flu season approaching this fall please be mindful of your health and who you surround yourself with. We ask if you don't feel good please stay home. We want to see you healthy and our goal is to protect the residents and our staff.

Masks are to be worn when in resident common spaces or hallways and always remember to wash your hands.

Abe had a hard time recovering after Vietnam and he thanks his sister, Audrey, and her husband, Denis, for all their support and love to lift him up in his darkest days. Audrey helped Abe go to school and get his life back on track. Abe has loved watching his nieces grow up and now gets to be Uncle Abe to his niece's kids too!

Abe has a love for faith and loves to read literature about Mother Teresa. He also loves to tend to the plants around Arbor Terrace, make necklaces and dream catchers, and grace visitors with some classic rock and roll when they come in Arbor's front door.


