


### Minnesotans Agree: Care For **Seniors Needs To Be A Higher Priority**

A strong majority of Minnesotans recognize the growing needs of the state's elderly, and they believe more resources and funding are needed to provide the care and housing for our senior population. Further, a majority of residents say state government must play an important role in funding care for the elderly, a new survey reveals.

#### A Right to Care

Minnesotan's agree that people over 65 years old should have the right to receive a basic level of housing, medical care and other support.



...of Minnesotans agree that the state should help fund day-to-day services for seniors who cannot afford these services on thier own.

Two-thirds of Minnesotans believe the state is lagging in funding for senior services, such as assisted living and nursing home care.



Services for the elderly ranked 2nd behind K-12 education as an area that needs more state funding, even if a tax increase would be required.


#### Minnesota's Senior Boom
