We are also going to have an open house for prospect residents to visit Arbor Terrace on May 16th & 19th.







The First Mother's Day



AWW Jown first organized observances in Grafton (West Virginia) & Philadelphia on May 10, 1908. As the annual celebration became popular around the country, Jarvis asked members of Congress to set aside a day to honor mothers. She finally succeeded in 1914, when Congress designated the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day.






Mother's Day is the busiest day of the year for many restaurants.

Americans do).




About 400,000 of those bouquets consisted solely or primarily of roses, while 300,000 people opted for tulips, and a further 300,000 chose freesia.

In addition to the 3.7 million bouquets, about 100,000 opted for potted plants instead.


